

### SECURING OUR BORDERS IS A MUST!

The impact of our nation's unsecured border with Mexico is being felt here in the Keystone State.

With a recent rise of ghost flights, which are untracked, unmonitored flights carrying undocumented illegal aliens into the United States, legislation was introduced in the House to urge federal officials to address the problem. House Resolution 294 urges Congress and the federal government to address ghost flights.

If ghost flights continue, this policy not only risks the safety of our communities but also the safety of the foreign aliens. The policy also skews census data and impedes the election process.

Congressional and Electoral College apportionment is based on the number of residents, as determined by the Census, which, following an executive order by President Joe Biden, includes illegal aliens and other noncitizens as residents.

As such, states can receive additional congressional districts and representation in Congress should it have an influx of illegal aliens who aren't even allowed to vote. This creates inequality at the expense of other states that, in theory, could have more legal residents but a smaller overall population than states with a high number of illegal aliens.

Such a scenario also impacts presidential elections. The Electoral College is based on the number of senators and representatives.

Ultimately, the solution is to secure borders. Until that happens, steps must be taken to stop ghost flights and protect the citizens of the United States.

## **Working to Deliver Inflation Relief**

As we all pay more and more of our hard-earned money for basic necessities, such as utilities, groceries and gas, not to mention everything else, House Republicans are working to pass legislation to deliver "Bidenflation" relief through tax breaks to residents.

The initiative stands in stark contrast to Democrats' plans to grow the size and cost of government by spending down the state's reserves, which would worsen Pennsylvania's financial future and not give anything back to hard-working Pennsylvanians. The Republican tax cut plan would put about \$3 billion annually back into the pockets of taxpayers, helping them deal with the ongoing burden of inflation.

The bills range from permanent exemptions from the Sales and Use Tax for items such as children's books, cribs and youth sports equipment to reducing the Personal Income Tax (PIT) rate from 3.07% to 2.8% and eliminating the Gross Receipts Tax on energy, providing critical relief from high energy costs.

Another piece of legislation, House Bill 165, would increase funding for the Homestead and Farmstead Exclusion by redirecting ALL revenue generated from gaming that is designated for the General Fund to be used to cut school property taxes.

If you aren't already enrolled in the Homestead and Farmstead Exclusion program, I strongly recommend you sign up. The program provides school property tax relief to homeowners who live in owner-occupied homes and is funded through gaming revenue. To sign up for the program, go to **DCED.pa.gov**, contact my office, or contact the Lancaster County Tax Assessment Office.
